OUR UNSUNG HEROES




By the Numbers...

A NEW YEAR AND A NEW CHALLENGE!! Tackling Food Insecurity

Growing up many of us were fortunate enough to come from a home with parents who were great providers so we never had to deal with the issue of food insecurity. In short, we never had to wonder where our next meal was coming from. Sadly the same cannot be said for many of the people who live in the communities that we serve. This is especially true as a result of the worsening conditions created by the pandemic. People who were already living at the margins have found it even harder to make ends meet. Widows, orphans, seniors and children have been impacted the most.

To respond to this growing need, Isaiah Projects is launching a three pronged approach to helping fight the issue of food insecurity:

1) delivering Food Packages for Families

2) growing our Feeding Programs

A message from the Executive Director

It's time!

If you are anything like me you are living in a place that is made up of 3 parts Covid fatigue, 1 part February blahs with a healthy pinch of winter blues thrown in! It is not a great place to be, but rather than complain I have decided to take matters into my hands and to do something about it. After two years of putting life on hold I have decided to go to Peru. I am booked to visit our team there from March 23rd to May 5th (6 wonderful weeks) and I cannot express how excited I am at the thought of interacting with everyone there whom I hold so near and dear to my heart. I know that maintaining social distancing is going to be a real challenge initially (o.k. I admit it I am a natural born hugger) but that is a calculated risk that I am prepared to take. I am triple vaccinated and will be taking a healthy supply of KN95 masks with me; I am going to be well prepared. Thinking of KN95 masks, a huge thank you to Lisa Lam for procuring the masks and donating 20 dozen for me to distribute while I am there.

So why Now?

If you have read through the rest of this newsletter you will know that God has laid it on my heart to make 2022 the year to help address food insecurity. I am not naïve enough to believe we are in any way tackling the issue of world hunger, but Isaiah Projects has never been about that; it has always been a grassroots movement of a small number of committed people who realize that by helping even one person we are making a significant difference. For the 500 families that I have targeted to help, and the kids who will attend our feeding programs now and in the future, we will have answered Jesus' call to share our food with those in need. As with any initiative I launch, Wendy and I want to demonstrate our commitment by making a donation in support of the program. We have covered the first three food packages for families now and will re-visit the initiative throughout the year making additional investments. I would invite each of you to consider joining us by making a commitment, however small, to help at some point in 2022.

In my six weeks in Peru I am planning to visit many of our feeding program sites including the two in Pachacutec (the churches run by Pastora Magaly and Pastor Javier Colonia), and the programs in Haucho and Carabyllo. I will be travelling to Satipo to see the new program we are introducing there, and to Yurimaguas to visit Geiner and observe the new program there also. I am praying for a good response to the Food Insecurity Program so that I can also distribute at least 100 family food packages during these visits. Finally I will be in Puerto Maldonado for about two and a half weeks working on how we can better use the land we possess to grow produce that can help supplement these programs. It will be an exciting six weeks and I am pondering whether to blog the whole experience so that I can share how God is working through our ministry. If you would read a blog like this please let me know, it would definitely help me in my decision making.
